# Policy for Slow Learners And Advanced Learners (2023-24)



#### Introduction:

Contrary to common belief, slow learners in the regular classroom are neither rare nor unique. The student commonly called a slow learner is one who cannot learn at an average rate from the instructional resources, texts, workbooks, and learning materials that are designed for the majority of students in the classroom. These students need special instructional pacing, frequent feedback, corrective instruction, and/or modified materials, all administered under conditions sufficiently flexible for learning to occur. Differentiation within the classroom provides students with the best environment for having their academic needs met. Differentiation is the least intrusive intervention for gifted students, who - like all students - should be seen to be "only as special as necessary."

#### Objective:

- Helps to differentiate students among types of knowledge.
- Helps to ensure that students are practicing the "right" skills that is, those things that you want them to learn.
- Helps to ensure that your course balances independence with guidance in a way that is appropriate for students' level.
- Helps students to learn new material in such a way that they can flexibly and appropriately use it in a variety of contexts, both in the short term and down the road.
- Helps students build metacognitive skills.



# Criteria To Identify Slow Learners And Advanced Learners After Admission

The newly admitted students at the entry level are categorized as Advanced learners, Average learners and Slow learners on the basis of their marks obtained in MHT-CET- the entrance examination for admission to First Year B Pharm conducted by State Government.

The percentile score of the student is calculated by comparing with the highest mark scored by the admitted student in MHT-CET. Accordingly students are categorized as follows:

Advanced Learners – 80 % and above Average Learners – 50%-80% Slow Learners – Below 50%

During the internal theory and practical sessional examination and continuous assessment, faculty monitors the performance of the students for respective courses. Based on it student are further grouped into slow learner if they scores less than 40% marks in any of the first continuous internal assessment and first ten toppers as advanced learner.



# Broad Guidelines to Identify Slow Learners And Advanced Learners

The learning style of student is assessed online through questionnaires on <a href="https://www.webtools.ncsu.edu/learningstyles/">www.webtools.ncsu.edu/learningstyles/</a>. The learning style of student's such as Active, Sensing, Visual, Sequential, Reflective, Intuitive, Verbal and Global are identified.

The learning level of the students after admission is assessed by:

- 1. Results of their previous examinations.
- 2. Interactive sessions.
- 3. Continuous evaluation.
- 4. Performance in regular classes.

Student who scores less than 40% marks in their any of the first CIE are considered to be low performers while and first ten toppers as advanced learner. At the institute, each faculty is assigned the responsibility of some students as a teacher guardian (mentor). The mentor identifies the slow learners and advanced learners of his/her group and provide differential mentoring so as to help the slow and advanced learners" bank on their strength and reach their full potential.

The identification of slow learners is carried by close monitoring, feedback and follow up. The designated mentor is the point at which such cases are easily identified and remedial measures initiated to effectively control the dropout cases. Special learning attentions are provided for these weaker sections through tutorials. Problems are identified through their counselors and remedies are proposed.



# Broad Guidelines of activities conducted for Slow Learners

# The learning needs of slow learners are countered by

- a. Regular counseling during mentoring sessions for improvement in performance.
- b. Remedial classes.
- c. Expert lectures
- d. Tutorial classes for some difficult subjects.
- e. Providing study material and question bank to students.
- f. One to one interaction with subject experts.
- g. Giving assignments to boost their confidence level.
- Discussions on critical topics and motivating them to ask their doubts.
- i. Monitoring their attendance.
- j. Conducting class tests
- k. Special Guidance Scheme



#### Broad Guidelines of activities conducted for Advanced Learners

For advanced learners various challenging opportunities like paper presentations in conferences are opened to make use of. Further, they are advised to participate in various inter college fests which adds value to their exposure and résumé. The advanced learners are motivated to undertake enrichment and add-on courses on priority basis. The advanced learners are also guided to pursue higher education and provided guidance for higher courses by holding special sessions for GPAT/NIPER/CET/MBA etc.

- a. To appreciate academic excellence, top rankers are felicited and rewarded every year during annual social gathering and Accolade.
- b. Extra guidance provided by faculty through personal interactions motivating the students for better performance in competitive exams.
- Motivating and providing career guidance for higher studies, employability, entrepreneurship, etc.
- d. Conducting preparation classes and assessment modules for the GPAT and other competitive examinations.
- e. Interaction with alumni through alumni association.
- f. Assigning seminars/projects and group leadership.
- g. Arranging guest lectures, seminars and workshops.
- h. Motivating and deputing the students to participate in in-house, intercollegiate or state, national and international seminars and conferences.
- Providing in house- training of sophisticated instruments and equipments through certificate courses.
- j. Publishing review articles on project work done by students.
- k. The college also gives "Student of the Year Award" every year.



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#### MODEL ANSWERS

#### Q.1. Discuss mechanisms of drug resistance.

#### Drug Resistance

Bacteria are considered resistant to an antibiotic if the maximal level of that antibiotic that can be tolerated by the host does not halt their growth. Some organisms are inherently resistant to an antibiotic. For example, most gram-negative organisms are inherently resistant to vancomycin. However, microbial species that are normally responsive to a particular drug may develop more virulent or resistant strains through spontaneous mutation or acquired resistance and selection. Some of these strains may even become resistant to more than one antibiotic.

#### A. Genetic alterations leading to drug resistance

Acquired antibiotic resistance requires the temporary or permanent gain or alteration of bacterial genetic information. Resistance develops due to the ability of DNA to undergo spontaneous mutation or to move from one organism to another.

#### B. Altered expression of proteins in drug-resistant organisms

Drug resistance is mediated by a variety of mechanisms, such as an alteration in an antibiotic target site, lowered penetrability of the drug due to decreased permeability, increased efflux of the drug, or presence of antibiotic-inactivating enzymes.

#### 1. Modification of target sites:

Alteration of an antibiotic's target site through mutation can confer resistance to one or more related antibiotics. For example, S. pneumoniae resistance to  $\beta$ -lactam antibiotics involves alterations in one or more of the major bacterial penicillin-binding proteins, resulting in decreased binding of the antibiotic to its target.

#### 2. Decreased accumulation:

Decreased uptake or increased efflux of an antibiotic can confer resistance because the drug is unable to attain access to the site of its action in sufficient concentrations to injure or kill the organism. For example, gram-negative organisms can limit the penetration of certain agents, including  $\beta$ -lactam antibiotics, as a result of an alteration in the number and structure of porins (channels) in the outer membrane. Also, the presence of an efflux pump can limit levels of a drug in an organism, as seen with tetracyclines.

#### 3. Enzymatic inactivation:

The ability to destroy or inactivate the antimicrobial agent can also confer resistance on microorganisms. Examples of antibiotic-inactivating enzymes include 1)  $\beta$ -lactamases ("penicillinases") that hydrolytically inactivate the  $\beta$ -lactam ring of penicillins, cephalosporins, and related drugs; 2) acetyltransferases that transfer an acetyl group to the antibiotic, inactivating chloramphenical or aminoglycosides; and 3) esterases that hydrolyze the lactone ring of macrolides.

#### Q. 2. Explain the term superinfections.

A superinfection is a second infection superimposed on an earlier one, especially by a different microbial agent of exogenous or endogenous origin, that is resistant to the treatment being used against the first infection. Examples of this in <u>bacteriology</u> are the overgrowth of endogenous <u>Clostridium difficile</u> which occurs following treatment with a <u>broad-spectrum antibiotic</u>, and <u>pneumonia</u> or <u>sepsis</u> from <u>Pseudomonasaeruginosa</u> insome <u>immunocompromised</u> patie nts.

#### **PENICILLINS**

#### A. Mechanism of action

The penicillins interfere with the last step of bacterial cell wall synthesis (transpeptidation or cross-linkage), resulting in exposure of the osmotically less stable membrane. Cell lysis can then occur, either through osmotic pressure or through the activation of autolysins. These drugs are bactericidal and work in a time-dependent fashion. Penicillins are only effective against rapidly growing organisms that synthesize a peptidoglycan cell wall. Consequently, they are inactive against organisms devoid of this structure, such as mycobacteria, protozoa, fungi, and viruses.

#### 1. Penicillin-binding proteins:

Penicillins also inactivate numerous proteins on the bacterial cell membrane. These penicillin-binding proteins (PBPs) are bacterial enzymes involved in the synthesis of the cell wall and in the maintenance of the morphologic features of the bacterium. Exposure to these antibiotics can therefore not only prevent cell wall synthesis but also lead to morphologic changes or lysis of susceptible bacteria. The number of PBPs varies with the type of organism. Alterations in some of these PBPs provide the organism with resistance to the penicillins. [Note: Methicillinresistant Staphylococcus aureus (MRSA) arose because of such an alteration.]

#### 2. Inhibition of transpeptidase:

Some PBPs catalyze formation of the cross-linkages between peptidoglycan chains. Penicillins inhibit this transpeptidase-catalyzed reaction, thus hindering the formation of cross-links essential for cell wall integrity.

#### 3. Production of autolysins:

Many bacteria, particularly the grampositive cocci, produce degradative enzymes (autolysins) that participate in the normal remodeling of the bacterial cell wall. In the presence of a penicillin, the degradative action of the autolysins proceeds in the absence of cell wall synthesis. Thus, the antibacterial effect of a penicillin is the result of both inhibition of cell wall synthesis and destruction of the existing cell wall by autolysins.

#### **Adverse reactions**

Penicillins are among the safest drugs, and blood levels are not monitored. However, adverse reactions may occur



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- 1. Hypersensitivity: Approximately 5% percent of patients have some kind of reaction, ranging from rashes to angioedema (marked swelling of the lips, tongue, and periorbital area) and anaphylaxis. Crossallergic reactions occur among the  $\beta$ -lactam antibiotics. To determine whether treatment with a  $\beta$ -lactam is safe when an allergy is noted, patient history regarding severity of previous reaction is essential.
- **2. Diarrhea:** Diarrhea is a common problem that is caused by a disruption of the normal balance of intestinal microorganisms. It occurs to a greater extent with those agents that are incompletely absorbed and have an extended antibacterial spectrum. Pseudomembranous colitis from Clostridium difficile and other organisms may occur with penicillin use.
- **3. Nephritis:** Penicillins, particularly methicillin, have the potential to cause acute interstitial nephritis. [Note: Methicillin is therefore no longer used clinically.]
- **4. Neurotoxicity:** The penicillins are irritating to neuronal tissue, and they can provoke seizures if injected intrathecally or if very high blood levels are reached. Epileptic patients are particularly at risk due to the ability of penicillins to cause GABAergic inhibition.
- **5. Hematologic toxicities:** Decreased coagulation may be observed with high doses of piperacillin, ticarcillin, and nafcillin (and, to some extent, with penicillin G). Cytopenias have been associated with therapy of greater than 2 weeks, and therefore, blood counts should be monitored weekly for such patients

#### Q.4. Discuss in short about β-LACTAMASE INHIBITORS

 $\beta$ -lactamases are a family of enzymes produced by many gram-positive and gram-negative bacteria that inactivate  $\beta$ -lactam antibiotics by opening the  $\beta$ -lactam ring. Different  $\beta$ -lactamases differ in their substrate affinities. Three inhibitors of this enzyme clavulanic acid, sulbactam and tazobactam are available for clinical use.

Clavulanic acid Obtained from Streptomyces clavuligerus, it has a  $\beta$ -lactam ring but no antibacterial activity of its own. It inhibits a wide variety (class II to class V) of  $\beta$ -lactamases (but not class I cephalosporinase) produced by both gram-positive and gram-negative bacteria. Clavulanic acid is a 'progressive' inhibitor: binding with  $\beta$ -lactamase is reversible initially, but becomes covalent later—inhibition increasing with time. Called a 'suicide' inhibitor, it gets inactivated after binding to the enzyme. It permeates the outer layers of the cell wall of gramnegative bacteria and inhibits the periplasmically located  $\beta$ -lactamase.

**Pharmacokinetics** Clavulanic acid has rapid oral absorption and a bioavailability of 60%; can also be injected. Its elimination t½ of 1 hr and tissue distribution matches amoxicillin with which it is used (called coamoxiclav). However, it is eliminated mainly by glomerular filtration and its excretion is not affected by probenecid. Also, it is largely hydrolysed and decarboxylated before excretion, while amoxicillin is primarily excreted unchanged by tubular secretion.

#### Uses

Addition of clavulanic acid re-establishes the activity of amoxicillin against  $\beta$ -lactamase producing resistant Staph. aureus (but not MRSA that have altered PBPs), H. influenzae, N. gonorrhoeae, E. coli, Proteus, Klebsiella, Salmonella and Shigella. Bact. fragilis and Branhamella catarrhalis are not responsive to amoxicillin alone, but are inhibited by the combination.

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Amoxicillin sensitive strains are not affected by the addition of clavulanic acid. Coamoxiclav is indicated for:

- Skin and soft tissue infections, intra-abdominal and gynaecological sepsis, urinary, biliary and respiratory tract infections: especially when empiric antibiotic therapy is to be given for hospital acquired infections.
- Gonorrhoea (including PPNG) single dose amoxicillin 3 g + clavulanic acid 0.5 g + probenecid 1 g is highly curative

**Adverse effects** are the same as for amoxicillin alone; g.i. tolerance is poorer—especially in children. Other side effects are Candida stomatitis/vaginitis and rashes. Some cases of hepatic injury have been reported with the combination.

#### **Sulbactam**

It is a semisynthetic  $\beta$ -lactamase inhibitor, related chemically as well as in activity to clavulanic acid. It is also a progressive inhibitor, highly active against class II to V but poorly active against class I  $\beta$ -lactamase. On weight basis, it is 2–3 times less potent than clavulanic acid for most types of the enzyme, but the same level of inhibition can be obtained at the higher concentrations achieved clinically. Sulbactam does not induce chromosomal  $\beta$ -lactamases, while clavulanic acid can induce some of them. Oral absorption of sulbactam is inconsistent. Therefore, it is preferably given parenterally. It has been combined with ampicillin for use against  $\beta$ -lactamase producing resistant strains. Absorption of its complex salt with ampicillin—sultamicillin tosylate is better, which is given orally. Indications are: PPNG gonorrhoea; sulbactam per se inhibits N. gonorrhoeae.

• Mixed aerobic-anaerobic infections, intraabdominal, gynaecological, surgical and skin/ soft tissue infections, especially those acquired in the hospital.

**Tazobactam** is another  $\beta$ -lactamase inhibitor similar to sulbactam. Its pharmacokinetics matches with piperacillin with which it has been combined for use in severe infections like peritonitis, pelvic/urinary/respiratory infections caused by  $\beta$ -lactamase producing bacilli. However, the combination is not active against piperacillin-resistant Pseudomonas, because tazobactam (like clavulanic acid and sulbactam) does not inhibit inducible chromosomal  $\beta$ - lactamase produced by Enterobacteriaceae. It is also of no help against Pseudomonas that develop resistance by losing permeability to piperacillin. Dose: 0.5 combined with piperacillin 4 g injected i.v. over 30 min 8 hourly.
